SCHOLARSHIP AWARD TO EVANY LUNA




Evany Luna holding her scholarship from the Iron Horse Motorcycle Club in February 2019.

Erin Johnson—Awarded Life Saving plaque



Tracy Ambulance took over care and CPR was in progress enroute to the hospital. Once at the hospital the Tracy Ambulance crew stayed to continue CPR to help the ER staff. CPR was performed for

an hour before the doctor was finally able pulse. It was later found out that the child has returned home and doing well.

On March 25, 2019 the City of Tracy presented 4 ambulance members of the Tracy Ambulance that were on that call with an award for taking life saving measure. We do not always think about getting recognized for what we do. Saving lives is our job. For me the greatest reward is not getting an award but knowing I made a difference in someone's life.






World Wrestling Entertainment
